 - School Update:

School Locking: This past month, the campus started locking the glass doors entering the gathering space from the church and door 8 during school hours. This means the gym, gathering space, and presentation room are locked during school hours to increase student and staff safety.

MNSAA: All documents have been submitted to MNSAA for our visit. Now, we clean up loose ends and prepare for the visit in November.

Virtues In Practice(VIP): October students are focusing on Work

Service Project - Rake A Thon We have collected Roughly \$22,000 for the Rake a Thon so far. The goal is \$50,000. We have two weeks to collect.

Pastor Appreciation: On Wednesday, October 25, the students will show appreciation for Fr. Peter and all he does for the school and our faith community.

Storybook Theater: We are working with Storybook Theater this year for a one-week incentive theater experience. Students will have Auditions on November 6th, and the performances will be on November 10.

NWEA: Testing Staff will be meeting individually next week with an NWEA Data Coach to collaborate and develop a plan for using the data to guide instruction for the next few months. On Wednesday, the staff will meet as a group to look at whole school trends and analyze historical data. The time together will give us time to look at the curriculum and expectations and discover areas we excel and areas we need to focus on. Our kindergarten class is the highest we have ever seen on average for fall testing. We are looking into possible reasons. The preschool program is fantastic, good guessing, testing environment, etc... Our fall assessments give data for teachers to see what students are coming in knowing. This information helps guide instruction for the next few months and also allows individualized lessons to be selected for blended learning. A drop from spring to fall is natural. The drop from spring to fall for reading does cause us to look at this more in-depth. Last year's spring and this year's fall do represent a student body, so we will need to look at the data individually.

Staff Focus This Month

The staff has been using this month to build necessary relationships and teach routines to students. This year has started off really well! We are seeing students and their areas of growth and strengths. Teachers are collaborating and getting into the routine with their classes.

In leadership, there are a lot of things going on, MNSAA, Staffing (subbing and after school), training, fundraising, creating robust after-school offerings, middle school overnight needs, students' needs, etc... Thankfully, OLL has an amazing team of staff that help make it all successful.

Believe and Read

This year, 3rd grade started the Believe and Read reading program we are using through Groves Literacy Organization. We have a coach onsite every Friday working with 3rd-grade Title 1 teachers to ensure the capability of teaching the program. K-2 receives coaching every other week. Learn more about Believe and Read <u>Here.</u> There is also a Principal certification for Believe and Read, and I will complete this program this school year.

Coaching

This year, we continue to team up with Northshore Coaching to have an educational coach work with teachers each month to help them reach their teaching goals. Our coach works with three teachers each visit and will be here monthly through April. A CSCOE grant and Title 1 and 2 cover this coaching.


Virtues In Practice (VIP)

We started our VIP program this month. Each month, we will focus on a different virtue. Each week of the month, we introduce a different piece. Week 1, the virtue, week 2, a saint that exemplifies the virtue. Week 3, how to practice the virtue in school, and week 4, how to practice the virtue at home. Students can nominate for the VIP award. We are starting with focusing on our mission this month: Praise God, Work Hard, Love One Another

NWEA Testing

Students started the NWEA Growth assessment this week. Teachers use this data to help guide the instruction needed for each student. The results create a learning continuum for teachers where each student is placed where they are proficient and ready to learn to MN state standards, and teachers can plan instruction and small groups around this data.

Little Green Light software was ordered to allow one platform for donor cultivation, solicitation and reports. Consultant will migrate lists from: SalesForce, Parish, Gala, School and Excel into LGL. CSCOE Migration Grant of \$1500 submitted. LGL will cost between \$486 and \$648 a year depending on the number of constituents after migration. We receive \$200 off that range in the first year.

The End of Year appeal will go out Thanksgiving week asking for parish and school support. The parish will cover half of this expense.

This year Christmas and Easter cards will include a donation remittance envelope to non givers. The Christmas Card will be mailed December 10 to the entire list. Kathy Jo secured a donation for the cards to be printed.
